## **Introduction:**

The SSR for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Cycle of Accreditation was prepared and uploaded on the College website on 05.3.2015 and the hard copy was submitted to NAAC on 04.4.2015. This supplementary report comprises of the noteworthy developments that took place after the submission of the SSR.

## **Criteria I- Curricular Aspects:**

The College is running four Post Graduate Programmes namely Master of Arts in History, Punjabi, English, M.Sc. (Computer Science) and four Under Graduate Programmes namely B.A, B.Sc., B.Com and B.C.A. The institute also offers Diploma in Stitching and Tailoring, PG Diploma in Fashion Designing, DCA, PGDCA, Diploma in cosmetology and PG Diploma in Cosmetology. The courses offered by the college in different streams are relevant and cater to the needs of society. All courses incorporate ICT tools to make them globally competitive. Curriculum development through various Committees of different faculties ensures this. The college has an inbuilt mechanism to regularly review courses based on students' feedback, current needs and advances made in different subject areas.

### **1.1 Curriculum planning and implementation:**

Being a government aided college, affiliated with Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, the college has to follow the curriculum as prescribed by the university but our faculty members are actively involved in the curriculum design and development of the university as members of different Boards of Studies. During the sessions 2014-15, 2015-16, 2016-2017 ( till date ) the following teachers of our college have been nominated to different academic committees and boards to take part in the curriculum design exercise and are actively involved in the re-designing of different curricula of undergraduate and post graduate level courses.

Many of our teachers like Dr. Kanwaljit, Mrs. Harminder Kaur, Mrs. Harpinderjit Kaur, Mrs. Inderjit kaur, Mrs. Meenu Bhola and Dr. Monika Sawhney are the members of various professional and university forums involved in the curricula design and development. The detailed list of faculty members involved in curricula updation is given in **Annexure-A**.

Following measures are taken for the curriculum implementation in the institute:

- 1. Meeting of Heads of Departments with the Principal-** Regarding the Curriculum Planning and Implementation, a meeting of Heads of Departments is held under the Chairmanship of the Principal of the college Dr. Kanwaljit on to discuss the allocation of subjects to the teachers as per their choice and specialization. After the approval of the allocation, decision about the curriculum division is taken. The decision to hold monthly departmental academic committee meetings to ensure the timely delivery of syllabus contents to the students in the classes and other academic matters are considered.
- 2. Review of Curriculum aspects in College Staff Meetings:** Different aspects of curriculum are reviewed in the College Staff meetings.
- 3. Departmental Academic Committee Meeting:** As and when required Departmental Academic Committee Meeting is held to review the delivery of the syllabus and discuss the problems faced by the students regarding the availability of contents etc. Every member of the department is given free hand to suggest the changes in the syllabi so that recommendations can be sent to the different Boards of Studies for appropriate changes in the syllabi.

### **1.2 Academic Flexibility:**

The College is following the curriculum and academic calendar as prescribed by the Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar which includes Semester teaching days, examination schedule and holidays. Apart from this, a lot of flexibility is available in scheduling the teaching pattern, extension activities, scheduling of extension lectures, invited talks, seminars /conferences, presentations by the students. Keeping this academic flexibility in view, different departments plan their academic and other extra-curricular activities as per their consultation in the departmental academic committee meetings. The details of various activities organized by the various departments are given in the departmental activities report as appended in the later part of this report.



### **1.3 Curriculum Enrichment:**

To enrich the curriculum of different courses, the college supports class room teaching with extension lectures, excursion tours, Information technology supported presentations by the teachers and students, participation of students and teachers in National and International Seminars/Conferences etc. The details of these curriculum enrichment activities have been given in departmental activities in the later part of the supplementary report.h

### **1.4 Feed Back System:**

Since the session 2014-2015, the college has developed an efficient feed back system to improve the curriculum design and develop the courses as per the students' needs. It is also ensured that every student is given due opportunity to participate in the feed back process. The parents are also given due opportunity to meet teachers and express their concern (if any) and give their feed back. The mechanism of feed back is listed as follows:

- **Feed Back Proforma from the students:** At the end of each semester, students are given feed back Proforma to understand their view point which is analysed in the meetings of Heads of Departments and Principal. The Proformas are available for inspection with Mrs. Inderjit Kaur, Dean (Student Affairs).
- **Suggestion Box:** Two Suggestion Boxes have been placed in the campus to have a clear understanding of the students' and parents' problems to improve the quality and efficiency of the courses.

## **2.0 Criteria-II Teaching Learning and Evaluation:**

### **2.1 Student Enrolments and Profile:**

The admission committee has been formed to guide the students about admission. For undergraduate classes the admission is offered on first come first serve basis. The Admission Criteria for Post graduate courses depends on the merit, since the number of seats are limited. The details of Admissions made in different courses (Category wise in 2014-15, 2015-16) and the total number of admission till 18.8.2016 for session 2016-17 are given in **Annexure-B**

## **2.2 Catering to Student Diversity:**

The table in **Annexure-B** depicts that the college caters to a diversity of students in terms of categories like General, Scheduled Caste/ Backward Classes etc.

## **2.3 Teaching Learning Process:**

The Principal Dr. Kanwaljit addresses the students along with the faculty members at the start of every session. In this address, the students are apprised about the norms, rules and regulations of the college which they have to follow. They are also given instructions about the Library rules, Examination rules, participation in NCC/NSS/Cultural activities. Time table and other instructions are also passed on to the students during this assembly. They are also given information about the tutorial groups, teacher-taught relationship, mentoring system in the college, students' enrichment programmes, participation in various activities, engagement programmes and their evaluation system.

Class room teaching includes the following:

- Industry Visits
- Guest Lectures

Teachers play the role of motivators and mentors in tutorial groups which are organised last Saturday of every month. Proper mentorship record is maintained by the incharges of the tutorial groups. The role of the teacher as a tutor, motivator, catalyst, sustainer and moderator is clearly exhibited in the various activities organized by the college. The details of these activities are included in the departmental activities reports. The institute is striving at creating a congenial ambience for teaching faculty by providing them access to all academic facilities. On the other hand the college caters to all the needs of the non-teaching staff so that their work can proceed efficiently.

### **2.4 Teacher Quality:**

Higher education has become a major driving force of economic competitiveness in an increasingly knowledge-driven global economy. The imperative for countries to improve employment skills calls for quality teaching within educational institutions. The institute is committed to provide quality education in colleges and improve the skills of teachers from time to time by encouraging them to update their knowledge as per the needs of changing time. They are encouraged to participate in various seminars, conferences and workshops.

### **2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms:**

For internal evaluation Mid Semester tests are held in the month of October for odd semesters and in March for even semesters. Every teacher conducts class tests and keeps the record of attendance. For Post graduate courses written assignments and class presentations are also held. House Examination results are declared in time bound manner and the records are kept in the college office as well as departments. University final examination results are declared by Guru Nanak Dev University online on the University website. Adherence to the University Calendar is a must in the institute. Semester system has been introduced in all the courses – post graduate as well as undergraduate level. It reduces the load of the students and

inculcates regular and consistent study habits. Examination Branch of the college and teachers help the students to fill their examination forms.

## **2.6 Student Performance and Learning Outcomes:**

During the years 2014-15 and 2015-16, students of the college have shown remarkable results in the University Examinations. 17 students of the college have secured merit positions in Guru Nanak Dev University Examinations in different courses in 2014-2015 and 2015-2016(Details in **Annexure-C**). The details of the result for the session 2014-15 and 2015-16 are given in the **Annexure-D**.

## **3.0 Criteria-III Research, Consultancy and Extension:**

### **Promotion of Research:**

The College provides opportunities for research and scholarly activities at undergraduate and post graduate level. Seminars, conferences, workshops and extension lectures are held by various departments which lend high impact to the learning process making it critically analytical.

M.Sc (Computer Science) programme is a research oriented programme in which every student has to complete a research project in the fourth semester as per their area of specialization. In the year 2014-2015, 5 research projects and in session 2015-16, 2 research projects were completed in this programme by the students under the supervision of teachers. The detailed list of completed research projects by students of Post Graduate Department of Computer Science.is given in **Annexure-E**.

### **Research committee:**

The research committee is working in the college since 2015-2016. This committee keeps the record of the teacher progression in terms of research publications and their participation in various seminars, workshops, refresher courses etc. This committee in consonance with college authorities tries to help and guide the teachers in the field of research.

### **Research by the teachers of different departments:**

In last three years different faculty members published 2 books, 3 chapters in Ed. books, 5 research papers in International Journals, 3 research papers in National Journals, 8 research papers in different National and International Conferences. Our faculty has also delivered guest lectures and radio-talks at International platform. Seven faculty members

attended Workshops/FDPs/Refresher Courses/GOCs to enrich their knowledge. The details of research papers presented, published is given in **Annexure-F**.

### **Extension Activities and Institutional Social Responsibility:**

- **Swatch Bharat Abhiyan: 17-10-2015**

The college formally started the Bharat Swachhta Abhiyan in the college in which hundreds of students and teachers participated. Principal of the college Dr Kanwaljit along with her senior colleagues Mrs. Harminder Kaur Vice Principal, Mrs. Inderjit Kaur, Mrs. Harpinderjit Kaur, started the cleanliness drive from the Guru Teg Bahadur Hall of the college and swept up to the Principal's office and then to the Administrative Office. While speaking on the occasion, Dr. Kanwaljit said that the drive will continue forever now and it will become a part of the agenda of the college to improve the quality of life in the college campus. All the teachers and students took oath on this occasion that they would devote at least two hours in a week for the cleanliness drive which will include cleanliness of their surroundings, upliftment of the mind and inculcation of good thoughts. - **N.S.S:**

- In Feb, 2016 our & N.C.C cadets appeared in “CEE examination” , out of which 4 cadets passed the examination. 21 cadets appeared in “BEE examination” and passed with flying colours.
- Our college was again given the responsibility to organize and celebrate ‘International Yoga Day’ on 21-6-2016. Our 50 cadets attended the celebrations.

- **Anti Sexual Harassment Cell:**

The College has established Anti Sexual Harassment Cell to address the problems/complaints related to sexual harassment. This cell assures protection and all sorts of help to students in case of any untoward incident. A special lecture was organized on 17-8-16 by the cell to create awareness about girls’ rights. The resource person was Dr. Raghubir Kaur, Secretary, Desh Bhagat Yaadgar Hall Committee, Jalandhar.

## **Criteria IV: Infrastructure and Learning Resources:**

### **Development of Infrastructure and other Facilities:**

#### **1. Renovation of the main gate of the college:**

College Gate is a campus icon symbolizing a student’s entrance into the world of higher education. This past year, the College Gate underwent a major renovation,



repairing the road leading towards college campus and incorporating universal design features so that the gateway can be enjoyed by anyone who visits.

## **2. Solar Energy System:**

In addition to making Environmental Studies a part of our curriculum, our college has gone a step further by putting that theory into practice. In the first phase, the college has installed solar panels on the roof of the college and Administrative Block runs entirely on solar energy. Though the solar energy installation is a huge investment, but the college has started the process as it is a permanent solution to the environmental problem. This project has been financially supported by Mrs. Harmeet Kaur, a distinguished alumnus of our college.

## **3. New Accounting Lab:**

The college has established one new accounting Lab to meet the needs of the students. The accounting lab was inaugurated on 15-01-2015. It is equipped with a smart board and five computer systems.

## **4. Rain Water Harvesting Project:**

Today, Water Conservation in the world in general, and in Punjab in particular is a current issue. Keeping this thing in mind, Rain Water Harvesting Unit is established in front of the Canteen building. Its measurements are:

Length : 3ft  
Breadth : 3ft  
Depth : 10ft

Diameter of the pipe fixed in the pit is 10 inches. From our college, this is a minor but important step to conserve the rain water as well as for sustainable development.

## **5. Unit of Vermicompost in the College:**

Vermicompost is the compost prepared by the earthworms. Vermicompost unit is approximately 2 years old. There is one pit dug near the back gate of the college measuring 10.5 feet x 8.5feet approximately. At present this unit is operational and the compost prepared by it is used in the plants of our college. So on one side it handles the organic garbage of the college and on the other side it helps in the organic plantation.

## **6. Library:**

The library of the institute is a rich source of learning. It is accessible to a large number of students, irrespective of caste, creed, and society. The library is a store

house of knowledge for everybody. We have 25976 books on different subjects. We have added 784 books in last three years and more volumes are in the process of being added. This year the library database has been computerized. The library also provides newspapers, magazines, journals in print form to students and staff. The library has a large reading room with 100 seating capacity in it. Xerox machine is also installed in the library to provide the photocopy facility to the students and staff members.

#### **7. Gymnasium:**

To develop sports talent, in addition to the existing Sports Ground, a well-equipped Gymnasium has been added to the Campus. New sports equipment has been procured to enable students to get training regularly and excel in sports. The gymnasium is equipped with a Treadmill, Slimmer, Dumbles, Exercise Cycle, Twister etc.

#### **8. ICT Enabled Classrooms:**

Many departments are equipped with ICT enabled class rooms with internet facility. The focus has been on establishing effective teaching-learning environment necessary to address the needs of learners in a rapidly changing world. With the improvement in the infrastructure the teachers now have a greater access to diverse knowledge resources.

#### **9. Sanitary Pad Incinerator:**

The bathroom has been equipped with a sanitary pad disposal unit. It is important for instant disposal of used napkins in a very scientific and hygienic way. It burns the used sanitary napkins and other waste with electric coil. The incinerator is automated machine that switches off by itself once the process gets over. This incinerator has an emission outlet outside the room for the fumes developed during the incineration.
